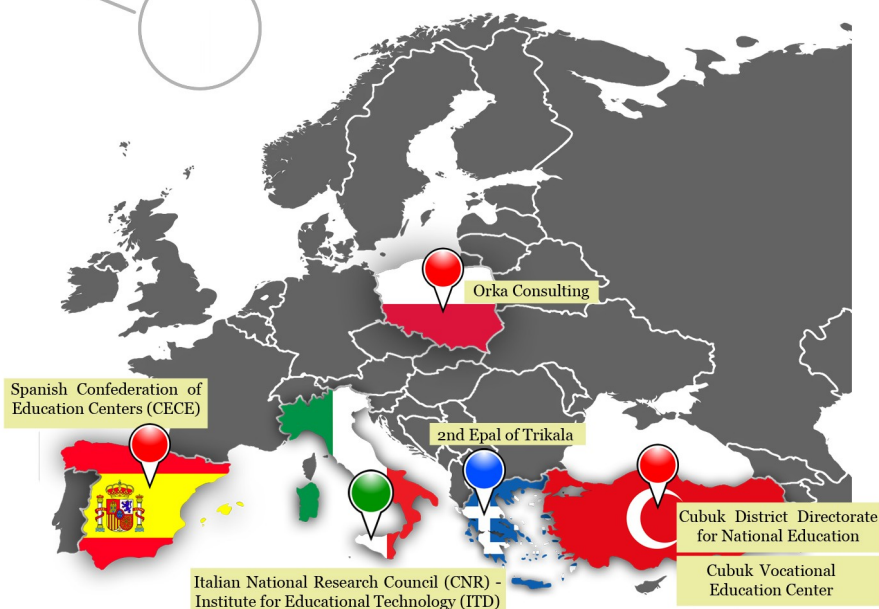

NecVET project focuses on sharing expectations and needs interactively between vocational education institutions and enterprises by generating new direct links and interconnections. The NecVET project will provide micro research study implementation in place of macro view in shaping educational policy. Moreover, it is going to contribute by directing vocational education policy and its contents in collaboration with local and regional social actors and adopting standardization in VET by supporting EQAVET programme.

- NecVET project plans to achieve the following outputs at the end of the project activities:
- Existing Situation Analysis (ESA) that will be obtained by means of research studies at local level in each participant country.
 - Applying expectation questionnaire in at least 10 different industrial sectors and its analysis.
 - Preparing informatory kits for vocational key competences and needs obtained through research studies.
 - Designing a web page that will facilitate sharing and introducing all project materials and work plan.
 - Identifying and comparing already existing vocational departments in vocational institutions in each participant country at local level. By this way vocational approaches and differences will be able to be seen among participant countries.
 - Organizing local informatory meetings such as seminar, conference or panel with participation of vocational education institutions and local actors.
 - Designing logo, poster, brochure and signs which will represent project name and its activities.
